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CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST FOUR CONTRACTORS

(*Reno, NV*) - At its meeting on May 4, 2004, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases against four (4) licensed contractors.

Henley Weber, license number 53084 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Fair Oaks, California was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to pay for materials or services; failure to cooperate in the investigation of a complaint; failure to establish financial responsibility; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; and diversion of money or property. The Board revoked the license of Henley Weber.

Aspen Construction, license number 41800 (Residential and Small Commercial) of Reno, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to pay required fines; failure to pay required Residential Recovery Fund disclosures; failure to pay for materials or services; failure to establish financial responsibility; and abandonment of a construction project. The Board revoked the license of Aspen Construction.

Advanced Construction, license number 46361 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Reno, NV was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license; failure to keep required records; and failure to establish financial responsibility; The licensee was fined \$2,250 and assessed the cost of investigation.

Hermann Construction, license number 38046 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Gardnerville, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to pay required fines and assessments; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; failure to provide required Residential Recovery Fund disclosures; failure to provide disclosures required for residential contracts; failure to establish financial responsibility; bidding in excess of established license limit; and misrepresentation of a material fact. The licensee was fined \$900 plus \$300 in Residential Recovery Fund back charges and assessed the cost of investigation.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
