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1. CALL TO ORDER:

Ms. Grein stated that Investigator Gordon LaPointe posted the agenda in compliance with the open meeting law on May 13, 2005 at Las Vegas City Hall, Sawyer State Building and Clark County Library. The agenda was also posted in both offices of the Board, Henderson and Reno and on the Board's Internet Website.

2. PUBLIC COMMENT:

No one from the general public was present to speak for or against any items on the agenda.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: April 21, 2005

It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes of April 21, 2005. MOTION CARRIED.

4. LEGISLATIVE DISCUSSION:

a. REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF AB 193 - REVISES PROVISIONS RELATING TO CONTRACTORS:

Ms. Grein reported that Assembly Bill 193 was amended and passed by the Senate on May 4, 2005, and was returned to the Assembly for concurrence.

b. REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF AB 501 - REVISES PROVISIONS GOVERNING CONTRACTORS:

Ms. Grein reported that Assembly Bill 501 was passed by the Senate and returned to the Assembly for concurrence.

c. REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF AB 537 – REVISES PROVISIONS CONCERNING SUBMITTAL OF CERTAIN QUESTIONS AND DISPUTES TO THE STATE CONTRACTORS BOARD:

Ms. Grein provided an update on the status of Assembly Bill 537.

d. REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF SB 300 - REVISES PROVISIONS GOVERNING CONTRACTORS:

Ms. Grein reported that Senate Bill 300 was amended and passed by Assembly Commerce and Labor, and returned to the Senate for concurrence.

e. REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF SB 434 - REVISES PROVISIONS GOVERNING CONTRACTORS:

Ms. Grein reported that Senate Bill 434 was amended and passed by the Assembly. The Bill was returned to the Senate for concurrence.

Ms. Grein stated that she had worked with representatives of the pool industry and that a compromise had been reached regarding bonding requirements.

It was moved and seconded to support the bill as amended. MOTION CARRIED.

Ms. Grein advised the Board that regulations will be required to establish guidelines for determining bond amounts.

<u>f. REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF ANY OTHER LEGISLATIVE MATTERS, INCLUDING SB 343 – REVISES PROVISIONS RELATED TO MECHANICS' AND MATERIALMEN'S LIENS:</u>

Ms. Grein advised the Board that Keith Lee had been retained as an additional lobbyist.

Ms. Grein reported that Senate Bill 343 is currently before the Assembly Judiciary.

g. LEGISLATIVE REPORT – BUZZ HARRIS, AMERICAN STRATEGIES, INC.:

Buzz Harris provided a status report on his legislative activities.

Ms. Grein provided a comparison summary of the four (4) proposals received.

It was moved and seconded to authorize Ms. Grein to move forward in discussions with Hartford Life regarding the possibility of providing service related to the Contractors Board pension fund and 457 plan. **MOTION CARRIED.**

d. REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF RESPONSES FROM VENDORS FOR INDEPENDENT AUDIT CONTRACT:

Ms. Grein provided copies of the proposals received from Kafoury, Armstrong & Co. and Solari and Sturmer, LLC.
