Mr. Sakowski was assessed a fine of \$500.00 for the First, Fourteenth and Seventeenth Causes of Action, a fine of \$250.00 for the Twelfth and Sixteenth Causes of Action, a fine of \$100.00 for the Thirteen Cause of Action and a fine of \$50.00 for the Second, Third, Fourth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh and Eighteenth Causes of Action for a total fine of \$2,600.00. The Fifth Cause of Action was dismissed. Investigative costs were assessed in the amount of \$3,921.00. The fine of \$50.00 for the Second, Third, Fourth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth and Eleventh Causes of Action is conditioned on Mr. Sakowski providing a proper contract to Investigator Welch within 30 days from May 24, 2005.
