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FIVE NEVADA CONTRACTORS DISCIPLINED BY CONTRACTORS BOARD

(Henderson, NV) – At its meetings on Oct. 22 and 23, 2008, the Nevada State Contractors Board

adjudicated cases involving five contractors.

Dream Deck Concrete Overlay, license number 63554 (Concrete Overlay & Restoration), based out of Henderson, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to take appropriate corrective action; failure to include the monetary license limit and license number on a contract or proposal; failure to respond to a written request from the Board; and failure to establish financial responsibility. The licensee was ordered to pay an administrative fine of \$2,500 and to pay investigative costs and make full restitution to all damaged parties and reimburse the Board for any monies paid out of the Residential Recovery Fund, plus fines and investigative costs. The license was revoked.

Summerland Construction, LLC, license number 51004 (Residential & Small Commercial), based out of Las Vegas, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to respond to a written request from the Board and failure to establish financial responsibility. The licensee was ordered to pay an administrative fine of \$750 and pay investigative costs and make full restitution to all damaged parties and reimburse the Board for any monies paid out of the Residential Recovery Fund, plus fines and investigative costs. The license was revoked.

Nanook Development, Inc., license numbers 68699 and 69035; *Armstrong Engineering & Development, LTD.*, license number 68698; and *B&R Concrete, LLC.*, license number 69035A (General Building, Concrete Contracting, General Engineering), based out of Las Vegas, NV, were found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to establish financial responsibility and for the partnership, corporation, firm or association participating in a prohibited act. The licensees were ordered to pay an administrative fine of \$500 pay investigative costs and make full restitution to all damaged parties and reimburse the Board for any monies paid out of the Residential Recovery Fund, plus fines and investigative costs. The licensees were revoked.

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Southwestern Pavers, Inc., license number 56640A (Masonry), based out of Las Vegas, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for aiding or abetting an unlicensed person; failure to ascertain that a bid on a construction project was from a licensed person; substandard workmanship; failure to take appropriate corrective action; failure to establish financial responsibility; failure to comply with the terms of a construction contract; failure to include the monetary license limit and license number on a contract or proposal; failure to respond to a written request from the Board; and for willful disregard of the building laws of the state. The licensee was ordered to pay an administrative fine of \$6,500; pay investigative costs and make full restitution to all damaged parties and reimburse the Board for any monies paid out of the Residential Recovery Fund, plus fines and investigative costs. The license was revoked.

Simon Construction Co., Inc., license number 56228 (Residential & Small Commercial), based out of Las Vegas, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to comply with an order of the Board. The licensee was fine of \$500; ordered to pay investigative costs and make full restitution to all damaged parties and reimburse the Board for any monies paid out of the Residential Recovery Fund, plus fines and investigative costs. The license was revoked.

******The Business Review Program is one in which a contractor's business practices and regulatory compliance is examined by NSCB investigative staff. The program is a part of NSCB's proactive investigative efforts.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.

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
