Two Reno Contractors Receive Citations For Alleged Unlicensed Activity

Nevada State Contractors Board investigators recently conducted sting operations in the Reno area for alleged unlicensed contracting activity.

Timothy P. Dryer, dba Capitol Overhead Door, Inc., was issued a criminal citation for *contracting without a license*. Dryer provided a bid for the installation of a garage door. He had been advertising on Craig's List under "New/Used Garage Doors for Sale." Dryer, a former Nevada contractor, had his license, number 22971B, revoked on April 4, 2009.

Gustavo Garcia Padilla was issued a criminal citation for *contracting without a license*. Padilla provided a bid for the installation of pavers. He had also been advertising his services for landscaping, painting and tile, carpet and pavers installation

Contracting without a license in Nevada is a misdemeanor for the first offense, a gross misdemeanor for the second offense and a Class E felony for the third offense.

Homeowners who use unlicensed contractors are not eligible for the Residential Recovery Fund, and by law their contracts are null and void.

The NSCB recommends that homeowners not use unlicensed contractors because their work is generally poor quality, they are often uninsured and may not maintain Workman's Compensation coverage for their employees, and the homeowner may be liable for all injuries to workers.
